Programs and Information

Cass House—PSH:

Residents live here in single and double rooms. They were homeless, test positive for HIV or are diagnosed with AIDS and may have other illnesses.

Arthur Antisdel Apartments—PSH:

Residents live in one-bedroom apartments. They were homeless, have a physical and/or mental disability, may be in recovery from substance abuse, or other conditions.

Brady Building Apartments—PSH:

Residents live in one-bedroom apartments. They were homeless, have a physical and/or mental disability, may be in recovery from substance abuse, or other conditions.

Littleton Building Apartments—PSH:

Residents live in one-bedroom apartments. They were chronically homeless, have a physical and/or mental disability, may be in recovery from substance abuse, or other conditions.

Scott—PSH:

Residents live in single rooms. They were chronically homeless, have a physical and/or mental disability, may be in recovery from substance abuse, or other conditions.

Thomasson Apartments—PSH:

Residents live here in studio and one-bedroom apartments. They were homeless, have a physical and/or mental disability, may be in recovery from substance abuse, or other conditions.

Travis—PSH:

Residents live in single rooms. They were chronically homeless, have a physical and/or mental disability, may be in recovery from substance abuse, or other conditions.

Skill Building Program:

This day program is for adults with developmental disabilities.

Green Industry Jobs:

Cass recycling, repurposing, and creative jobs and micro businesses provide vocational education and employment.

Emergency Shelters Available:

Through referrals from Detroit's Coordinated Assessment Model (CAM), temporary housing is available for persons without a place to sleep. These services are available for all adults (ages 18 & up) and children.
